PLANNING SHEET FOR CATHOLIC FUNERAL MASS

Dear Families: This planning sheet is designed to help guide you through some of the different choices you can make as you plan the funeral Mass for a loved one.

The areas shaded in gray designate where you can select a song or Scripture reading or where family members can assist in the funeral liturgy. Please note that families can be involved as much or as little as they like in these selections. Our clergy and funeral ministry team are ready to assist in any way needed.

Please Note: We encourage families who would like to share memories of loved ones to use the time of visitation at the funeral home, the wake service, or a funeral reception to do so. With the pastor's permission, a single speaker may share words of remembrance immediately before the start of the funeral Mass. Families must submit a written copy two days before the funeral for review. The length must not exceed 550 words.

SELECTING MUSIC FOR THE FUNERAL LITURGY

The Role of Music in the Funeral Liturgy

As you begin to plan the funeral of a loved one, you will be called upon to make important choices about the readings and prayers to be used during the rites. As you make these decisions, consider also the incredible power of music in the funeral Mass. Music may help us to express feelings that words alone may fail to convey. It may console and uplift us in times of sadness, and unite us with other mourners in faith and love. The music to be sung during the funeral liturgy need not necessarily be sad; rather, it can express our faith and joy in the resurrection. The Music Ministry of St. John the Evangelist is committed to providing you with music that will offer comfort and hope to those who gather to remember a loved one.

Selecting the Music

Sacred and Secular

The music to be used in any Catholic funeral liturgy must first and foremost be liturgical music – that is, music that expresses the faith of the church and has been approved for use in worship. Sacred music exists in a variety of styles, from chant to traditional hymns to contemporary songs. Music from secular sources is not permitted in church, but can be incorporated outside of the funeral Mass during the wake or at a meal following the burial service.

Recorded Music

According to a recent document published by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, "Recorded music lacks the authenticity provided by a living liturgical assembly gathered for the Sacred Liturgy." (Sing to the Lord, 93) It is for this reason that the use of recorded music during the funeral Mass is strongly discouraged.

Suggested Musical Selections

A list of the most appropriate and most widely-requested liturgical music for funerals is provided. Many of these hymns can be found in the church's *Gather III* or *One In Faith* hymnals. Congregational singing is a sign of our unity and is strongly encouraged, but a solo piece sung by the cantor may be appropriate at other times during the liturgy. The suggested liturgical use for all of the traditional musical selections is provided. Contemporary songs found in the worship supplement booklets may also be used. Helen can provide you with a list of the songs in the current booklet.
